Getting to Leeds

People coming to Leeds usually need to arrive either by train or by plane. People flying may fly to either Leeds Bradford Airport (LBA) or into Manchester (MAN). There are fewer international flights into LBA, but people coming through Amsterdam may find some convenient options.

Getting to the University of Leeds from LBA: the quickest way to get to the city centre from Leeds Bradford Airport is via Uber (£20-25). Additionally, <u>a bus</u> runs every 30 minutes connecting the airport and the city centre (operated by the "Flyer" bus service, starts at £2 for a one-way ticket).

Getting to Leeds from MAN: People flying into Manchester may take the train from Manchester airport to Leeds Station, which will take at least 90 minutes and often costs around £30.

Getting to Leeds from London: Alternatively, if people fly into London or otherwise wish to come through London, the train from King's Cross station takes a little over two hours and prices start around £50.

Getting Around Leeds

Leeds is a reasonably hilly. The conference will be held on the University of Leeds campus. The University of Leeds is uphill from most places in the city and can be difficult to access by people with limited mobility. People with limited mobility may consider taking a taxi, uber, or bus to the campus.
